RESIDENCE PERMIT & VISA

As an exchange or full-time student from a country that is not a member of the European Union, you need a visa to enter Germany. You must apply for a student visa or a student applicant visa, as every German visa is tied to a specific purpose of stay. Please do not travel with a tourist visa, as this cannot be converted into a residence permit in Germany!

Note: Citizens of Australia, Israel, Japan, Canada, New Zealand, South Korea, the United States of America, Andorra, Brazil, El Salvador, Honduras, Monaco and San Marino do not require a visa to enter Germany for study purposes and can obtain the required residence permit for study purposes after entering Germany.

UNIVERSITY ACCOUNT

A university account has been created for you with your application to the TH Wildau. To receive your personal account and your e-mail address, please print out the account letter in the TH Wildau online portal. This account with your user name and password not only allows you to use the online portal of TH Wildau (thonline.th-wildau.de), but also gives you access to a variety of university services (e-mail, campus app, etc.).

In the online portal of the TH Wildau (accessible from the homepage under the heading "Study" or directly at thonline.th-wildau.de) you can, among other things

- Print out your account letter (at the beginning of your studies)
- Manage your university account
- Print out your certificate of enrolment
- Change your address and telephone number
- View invoices
- Retrieve your certificate of enrolment
- Retrieve your overview of grades

UNIVERSITY ID CARD (CHIP CARD)

After completing enrolment, students receive a university ID card in the form of a chip card. It has several functions and should always be carried with you in everyday student life.

The university ID card serves as:

- Student ID card
- Library card
- Access to the car park
- Access to the parent-child room
- Access to rooms with offline locking cylinders
- 24/7 access to the library (authorisation for 24/7 access must be requested at the university library)
- cashless means of payment (e.g. in the canteen) and as a copying quota (only applies to student employees)

To make cashless payments with the chip card, you must top up the card. Top-up stations: with cash or an EC card (giro card) in the entrance area of the canteen (right-hand side), entrance area of House 13 and Hall 17 and between rooms 16-1064 and 16-1065; with an EC card in the entrance area of the canteen and in the library copy room. Students must update their university ID card after each re-registration. Please use one of the validation stations (Building 13, 15, 16 or Hall 17). This does not apply to students on the part-time degree programmes in Business Administration (BFG) and Industrial Engineering (WFG).

DURING YOUR **STUDIES**

The following pages provide you with practical tips and information for your successful day-to-day study programme.



LIBRARY USE

At the TH Wildau you will find a highly modern and attractive library in an architecturally attractive former industrial building with excellent facilities. The university library has around 100,000 print media and 80,000 electronic media. Books from the textbook collection can be borrowed by students with a loan period of three months. Books from the open access collection can be borrowed for four weeks. You can also use a wide range of databases, online journals and e-books via WLAN on your own computer or at one of the eleven computer workstations. Using VPN or Shibboleth, most electronic media can also be accessed from off campus. Media that are not in the university library's collection can be optained via interlibrary loan.

University library facilities: Lecture room, media library, four work booths (carrels), group study room "Glaskasten" (all rooms can be reserved by students via the Unidos Wildau app), 150 workstations, 11 computer workstations, RFID self-checkout device for independent borrowing, renewal, return and reservation of media, online catalogue and library search engine WILBERT, digital library with over 80,000 titles of e-journals, e-books and databases.

Notes:

- To borrow printed media from the library, you must activate your library account once by registering in person at the library counter. Your university ID card is also your library card.
- All electronic media (except Beck-Online) can be accessed via VPN or partially via Shibboleth from can be used at home and when travelling.
- Some lockers in the library can only be locked with your own padlock, which you must bring with you. Therefore, please bring a small lock with you.
- For part-time study programmes only: All books that you need for your studies will be sent to you by post. It is therefore important to update changes of address in good time via the TH Wildau online portal.

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© Opening hours during the lecture-free period: Monday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday 09^{oo} to 16^{oo} Tuesday 09^{oo} to 18^{oo}

Students at TH Wildau can apply for 24/7 access to the university library. This gives you access to the library outside of regular opening hours using your university ID card.

STUDY ONLINE

A purely online degree programme is not currently offered at the TH Wildau, as most teaching takes place in person. Nevertheless, we would like to provide you with the following information, as individual teaching formats are also offered online.

- Make sure that you have a well-equipped workspace at home where you can work undisturbed.
- Online teaching, learning and examination formats differ from face-toface formats. Your lecturers will inform you accordingly. You will also find information on online and remote examinations at th-wildau.de/ elben/anleitungen/pruefungen.
- A minimum level of technical equipment is required. For example, a laptop with 2.2 GHz and 4 GB (8 GB recommended) is sufficient. Your internet connection should allow stable streaming. Further information can be obtained from the Support Centre of the University Computer Centre.

Online lectures

Lectures in online courses are often held using tools such as Big Blue Button or Cisco Webex. You can prepare for this with the following tips:

- Familiarise yourself with the tool before the first online lecture and test the technology.
 - Do you have functioning hardware? (Laptop, webcam, headset/microphone etc.)
 - Do you need to set up software?
 - · Can you hear/see others, write in the chat?
- Switch off any disruptive factors so that you are not interrupted when speaking and embarrassing situations are avoided:
- · Switch off notifications on the device!
- Switch off or mute the smartphone/landline phone temporarily!
- Put a "Do not disturb" note on the door!
- Log in with your first name and surname.
- Activate the video camera at the beginning so that the teacher can see that you are present. If possible, use a virtual background to avoid intimate insights into your own home. The Webex tool offers this option.
- Use a headset and mute your microphone. It is important to mute your microphone so that there is no background noise. If you do not have a headset, be sure to check whether the quality of the computer microphone is sufficient.
- Use the chat to ask questions or share helpful links. Be prepared for the fact that the lecturer may not be able to keep a constant eye on the chat during the lecture and will probably not comment on your entry immediately.
- Use every opportunity to become active. In some tools, you can use a hand signal to report or submit ratings.
- Ask your lecturer for a recording of the lecture if this is not provided. It can be very helpful to look at the recording again for follow-up work.

Online collaboration in learning groups

Tips for your learning group

- A learning group has several advantages: For example, you can discuss what you have learnt, clarify unanswered questions and motivate each other. If you tend to procrastinate, a study group can build up the necessary pressure.
- Which group size suits you? Some prefer to work in a learning partnership of two, others in a group. Learning groups of three to five students have proven to be a good choice.
- At the first meeting, clarify what goals you want to pursue in the learning group.
- Should a social exchange be allowed in addition to the content-related work? If so, it is best to agree on a time frame for this (e.g. five or ten minutes).
- Do you mainly want to clarify open questions or do you want to learn all the details for the exam together?
- Experience shows that a learning group works better if you agree on rules from the outset that are then adhered to by everyone.
 - Agree on a moderator (this role can rotate).
 - · How often do you want to meet?
 - Who completes which tasks by when?
- Set yourself specific weekly goals. And don't forget to regularly check whether you have achieved your goals.

Examination dates/examination periods

You are automatically registered for the examinations with each reregistration. The lecturers will announce the examination modalities within the first few weeks of the course. The examination modalities are set out in the examination schedule. The binding announcement of examination dates is made via the online portal of the TH Wildau (thonline.th-wildau.de). In addition, the dates are published in the timetable and examination schedule (th-wildau.de/stundenplan).

If you are unable to take part in an examination or repeat examination, you can deregister yourself via the TH online portal. The respective cancellation deadlines may differ depending on the type of examination (FMP, KMP or SMP) and are regulated in the framework regulations of the TH Wildau.

Illness

In the event of illness on an examination date, a completed "Application for Notification of Examination Prevention" including a medical certificate can be submitted to the Dean's Office of the faculty within three working days. The Examination Board will decide whether the examination attempt will be cancelled.

In the case of examinations during the semester (SMP), you should report your completed notification of examination cancellation directly to your lecturer. The lecturer will decide to what extent compensation can be granted. Details are regulated by the framework regulations of the TH Wildau.

Examination

The examinations can be taken orally, in writing in the form of written examinations and other written work, as project work, as laboratory experiments and through other controlled performances that can be assessed according to the same standards. The regulations can be found in the framework regulations in conjunction with the respective study and examination regulations.

Examination results

The announcement of the examination results is personalised on the online portal of the TH Wildau (thonline.th-wildau.de).

Exam inspection

In principle, students have the right to inspect examinations within four weeks of the publication of the examination results. Please contact your lecturer for this purpose.

Transcript of records

You can view your transcript of records at any time on the online portal of the TH Wildau (thonline.th-wildau.de) or obtain it for a fee from the Department of Admissions and Examinations.

Recognition of examination results

Recognition of examinations already taken at other universities can be granted for the current semester in which the module to be recognised is taught in accordance with the curriculum up to six weeks after the start of the semester. Applications must be submitted to the relevant examination board of the faculty.

RE-REGISTRATION FOR THE NEXT SEMESTER

Students at TH Wildau must re-register for each semester, in November for the following summer semester (deadline 30 November) and in May for the following winter semester (deadline 31 May). Information on re- registration will be sent to your university account by email and published on the website and on the notice board. Re-registration takes place by paying the fees and contributions on time. Re-registration is only complete once the full semester fee has been received.

Students must update their university ID card (chip card) after each reregistration. Please use one of the validation stations (House 13, 15, 16 or Hall 17). The chipcard is printed in these machines.



BAFÖG

Students who have not yet reached the age of 45 at the start of their studies can apply for educational support in accordance with the Federal Training Assistance Act (BAföG). BAföG is paid out if the student's own financial resources are not sufficient to finance their studies.

Student BAföG is usually granted half as a grant (does not have to be repaid) and half as an interest-free loan. The Studierendenwerk West-brandenburg (formerly Studentenwerk Potsdam) can provide you with information on eligibility and how to apply. It is possible to complete and submit the application online (https://www.bafoeg-digital. de). To support your application, you can use the BAföG Digital App, which allows you to upload missing documents and view the processing status of your application. The BAföG Digital app also includes a BAföG calculator. You can use this tool to determine your entitlement and need for educational support - even without logging into the app. Forms for paper applications can be found at the Studierendenwerk.

Incidentally, there will be improvements to BAföG in the winter semester 2024/25:

- Introduction of a study start-up grant of 1,000 euros for young people from communities in need within the meaning of SGB II or with similar social benefits (e.g. housing benefit, citizen's allowance, child supplement) for initial equipment during their studies
- Introduction of a flexibility semester, which can be used once without further requirements beyond the maximum funding period of the respective degree programme
- Extension of the period within which a change of specialisation can be made
- Increase in the allowances on the income of parents and spouse or partner of the subsidised person

uring the course of your studies, you must submit certificates of achievement to the Office for Educational Support. The BAföG officers at TH Wildau (departmental section) are authorised to issue the necessary certificates of your achievements. Alternatively, you can also provide the BAföG office with proof of performance by submitting an automatic overview of your performance at the university with the credit points achieved, which proves the usual level of performance at the relevant time. MODERN CAMPUS UNIVERSITY WITH TRADITION

Wildau University of Applied Sciences was founded in 1991, but the site has a much longer tradition of engineering education. In 1898, Germany's third largest locomotive manufacturer, Berliner Maschinenbau AG, formerly L. Schwartzkopff, built a new factory and housing estate for workers on the 600,000 square metre site. In 1949, to meet the growing demand for skilled workers, a technical school for locomotive and wagon construction was founded. In the course of the re-profiling of the site as a heavy engineering centre, this became the Ingenieurschule für Maschinen Wildau (ISW) - the immediate predecessor of today's TH Wildau. The institution quickly gained a good reputation for training mechanical engineers. This was mainly due to its direct links with local engineering companies, its solid and application-oriented knowledge transfer and the modern equipment in its laboratories.

COMMITTEES

Within the framework of academic self-administration, decisions and resolutions on the strategy and development of the university , the design of degree programmes and other matters are made in various committees. The central decision-making body of the university is the Senate, while the most important decision-making bodies of the departments are the faculty boards.

Senate

The Senate is the central decision-making body of the university with the function of a supervisory board. It elects the President of the university, issues the basic regulations and other central statutes and decides on proposals from the departments for the appointment of professors. The Senate deals with questions of strategy and the development of the TH Wildau.

The Senate is made up of

- 6 professors
- 2 academic employees
- 2 students and
- 1 other employee

The members of the Senate are elected by the respective group in university-wide elections every two years. The students, however, are elected annually in the same way as the Faculty Board.

Quality and Accreditation Commission

Wildau University of Applied Sciences has been system-accredited since 31 March 2015. The subject of system accreditation is the university's internal quality assurance system. The Quality and Accreditation Commission is an essential component of the internal accreditation system. Within this system, the degree programmes at TH Wildau are accredited every eight years. In addition - as part of the annual quality audit an inventory of changes within all study programmes is carried out, which are checked for their relevance with regard to the existing accreditation. Finally, the Quality and Accreditation Commission makes the accreditation decisions for the individual procedures and recommends measures as part of the annual quality audit.

The members of the Quality and Accreditation Commission are appointed by the Senate. The objectives and organisational principles of the commission are derived from the statues adopted by the Senate.

STUDENT REPRESENTATION

All students at the TH Wildau form the student body of our university. As a sub-body with legal capacity, it manages its own tasks.

Tasks of the student representatives:

- Representing the interests of students
- the promotion of political education and the intellectual and artistic interests of its members
- participation in the fulfilment of the tasks of the universities, in particular by issuing statements on university-related or science policy issues
- Supporting the social concerns of its members
- Cultivating supra-regional and inter-regional dialogue national relations of the students
- the promotion of sport as part of the university sports programme

The tasks of the student body at the TH Wildau are carried out by the Student Council (StuRa) and the Student Parliament (StuPa).



StuPa – Student Parliament

The student parliament is the highest decision-making body of the student body. It elects and monitors the StuRa officers, approves the budget and decides on programme guidelines. The StuPa is elected once a year by all students at the university. It is made up of up to 21 student representatives.

FACULTIES

The tasks of the faculties include the organisation of studies, the taking of examinations and the organisation of research. The TH Wildau is divided into two faculties in which the individual degree programmes are located:

- Engineering and Natural Sciences (INW)
- Business, Computing, Law (WIR)

The faculties are self-governing. Decisions on the design of degree programmes, curricula, the employment of lecturers, appointments of new staff, student applications, etc. are made in the committees of a faculty. Students are also represented on these committees.

Faculty Board

The faculty council is the most important decision-making body of a faculty. All decisions regarding the structure of degree programmes, staffing, etc. are made here.

The members of the Faculty Board are:

- · 6 professors
- · 2 scientific employees
- 1 other employee
- 2 students

The Faculty Council also elects the representatives of these groups to the Examination Board or the appointment committees. The student members of the Faculty Council represent the interests of the students. If you have a concern, it is best to contact the student representative of your faculty.

Examinations Board

The Examination Board decides on student applications in examination matters. The meetingstakeplaceat regular intervals.

Study Commission

The study commission of a faculty is responsible for the subject-related and content-related processing of didactic and methodological issues of all degree programmes in the faculty and is constantly responsible for the planning and design of teaching as well as for the further development of module handbooks and curricula. Meetings are usually held once a semester. The Study Commission is a committee that is open to the teaching staff at the faculty without permanent members; as a rule, at least the respective degree programme spokespersons and the Dean are members. Students from different degree programmes may also be represented in the consultations. This gives students the opportunity to participate in the design and further development of the degree programmes and the department.

Degree programme directors

A course spokesperson is appointed for each degree programme to coordinate the subject, content and organisation.

He or she is responsible for professional cooperation and coordination of content and has a significant influence on the organisational process of the respective degree programme. You can find your degree programme spokesperson in the section of the respective department.

BAföG representative

In the INW department, the respective degree programme spokesperson is also the BAföG representative.

In the WIR department, Prof Dr Peter Hantel, Prof Dr Iciar Dominguez Lacasa and Prof Dr Stephan Meyer are BAföG officers.

Internship representative

The internship coordinator will inform and support you in the preparation and organisation of the practical semester and the selection of an internship company.

Year mentors

Year mentors are appointed for each degree programme. These mentors accompany and advise the students of a year group during the entire standard period of study. The mentor is your contact person for questions regarding special features of the course of study, e.g. study abroad periods, the choice of specialisations/ elective modules, preparation for practical study periods, final phases and changing degree programmes. You can enquire about your year mentor from your degree programme spokesperson.

Seminar group spokesperson or course spokesperson

At the start of the programme, each seminar group elects a seminar group spokesperson (also known as a course spokesperson) and a deputy. They represent the seminar groups vis-à-vis the lecturers and the degree programme spokesperson.

The seminar group spokesperson is responsible for forwarding university information to the seminar group. For this purpose, he or she sets up a seminar group distribution list (by e-mail). On the other hand, the seminar group spokesperson takes part in degree programme meetings with other seminar group spokespersons and is involved in the organisation of events for the seminar group.

UNIVERSITY SPORTS




