RESIDENCE PERMIT & VISA

As an exchange or full-time student from a country that is not a member of the European Union, you will need a visa to enter Germany. You must apply for a student visa or a study applicant visa, as every German visa is tied to a specific purpose of stay. Please do not enter Germany on a tourist visa, as this cannot be converted into a residence permit in Germany!

Please note: Citizens of Australia, Israel, Japan, Canada, New Zealand, South Korea, the United States of America, Andorra, Brazil, El Salvador, Honduras, Monaco and San Marino do not require a visa to enter Germany for study purposes and can obtain the necessary residence permit for study purposes after entering Germany.

EMAIL

With your university account, you can not only use the campus-wide Internet, but you will also automatically receive an email address ending in "@th-wildau.de". You can access your emails either in your browser at webmail.th-wildau.de or in an email client of your choice on your laptop/PC.

Information relating to your studies will <u>only</u> be sent to your university email address, so please check your messages regularly.

UNIVERSITY ACCOUNT / ONLINE PORTAL OF THE TH WILDAU

A university account has been created for you when you applied to TH Wildau. To receive your personal account and email address, please print out the account letter from the TH Wildau online portal. This account, with your username and password, not only allows you to use the TH Wildau online portal (thonline.th-wildau.de), but also gives you access to a wide range of university services (email, campus app, etc.).

In the TH Wildau online portal (accessible from the homepage under the heading "Im Studium" or directly at *thonline.th-wildau.de*), you can, among other things

- print out your account letter (at the beginning of your studies)
- Manage your university account
- Print your enrolment certificate
- Change your address and telephone number View invoices

- Retrieve your certificate of enrolment
- Retrieve your grade overview
- View invoices

UNIVERSITY ID CARD (CHIP CARD)

After completing enrolment, students receive their university ID card in form of a chip card. Due to its multiple uses, it is advisable to carry it with you at all times while enrolled.

The university ID card serves as:

- Student ID
- Library card
- Semester ticket (further information on page 16)
- Access to the car park
- Access to the parent-child room
- Access to rooms with offline lock cylinders
- 24/7 access to the library (you must apply for 24/7 access at the university library)
- Cashless payment method (e.g. in the cafeteria) and as a copy allowance (only applies to student employees)

In order to pay cashlessly, the chip card must first be loaded. Currently, cash can only be loaded at the entrance to the cafeteria or at the student services cash desks in the cafeteria. In addition, a new card recharger has recently been installed in House 13, where cards can be conveniently topped up using a debit card. Debit cards can also be used to top up cards in the entrance area of the canteen and in the library's photocopying room.

After each re-registration for the semester, the validity of the chip card must be updated. This validation can be done at special stations located in Houses 13, 15, 16 and in hall 17.

Loss or defect:

If you have lost your university ID card or it is no longer working, please report the loss or defect immediately to the Semesterticket Service Point or send an email to wicka@th-wildau.de.

ATTENDANCE DAYS (distance learning degree programme only)

The attendance days for the 2025/2026 winter semester of the part-time degree programmes in Business Administration (BFG) and Industrial Engineering (WFG) can be found on the website. In addition, there will be a week of block teaching for the Business Administration programme. You can apply for educational leave from your employer for this. The relevant application form is available from the Enrolment and Examinations Office. Please note that you must apply to your employer for educational leave at least six weeks before it begins and submit your application to the Enrolment and Examinations Office in good time.

SEMESTER TICKET

Your university ID card is also your semester ticket. Since 1 April 2024, the semester ticket has included the Germany ticket, so no additional upgrade is required. However, this ticket is only valid in digital form.

To extend the validity of your university ID card, please use the validation stations in Houses 13, 15 and 16 (between rooms 16-1064 and 16-1065) and in hall 17. This is subject to the condition that you have paid the re-registration fee by the deadline and have therefore successfully re-registered for the coming semester. If you have any questions regarding the refund of semester fees, please contact the Semester Fees Service Point. The Germany semester ticket can only be booked via the app. The area of validity is contractually regulated between the Student Council (StuRa) of TH Wildau and the VBB. LIBRARY USE

Friendly, open and perfect for working – welcome to the library at TH Wildau. With over 150,000 printed and digital media, the library offers all students, university members and guests an extensive and up-to-date collection of specialist literature. You will benefit from a modern working and learning environment with 150 workstations, several individual and group study rooms, and comprehensive services for relaxed and collaborative learning.

The library sees itself as a central component of study, research and teaching at TH Wildau – with a high level of service orientation and modern infrastructure.

Our facilities and services at a glance:

- Room reservations: 6 group study rooms ideal for teamwork, as well as 4 individual study cubicles (carrels) for concentrated learning. All rooms can be reserved via the Unidos Wildau app.
- Technical equipment: Printers, copiers, scanners, book scanners, PCs, self-checkout machines for easy borrowing, renewal, return and reservation of media.
- Digital library: Access to over 70,000 e-books, 20,000 e-journals and numerous databases – available online around the clock.
- Research & interlibrary loan: Convenient library search engine
 WILBERT and access to interlibrary loan for media not available in the library's collection.
- Wi-Fi access and use of your own devices or the available computer workstations.
- Access from outside: Via VPN or Shibbo leth, most electronic resources are also available from home or on the go.
- 24/7 access: Students and university members can apply for 24/7 access to the library and thus use the library outside regular opening hours with their university ID card.

Notes:

- To borrow printed media from the library, you must activate your library account once by registering in person at the library counter. Your university ID card is also your library card.
- All electronic media (except Beck-Online) can be accessed via VPN or, in some cases, via Shibboleth from home and on the go.
- Some lockers in the library can only be locked with your own padlock, which you must bring with you. Please bring a small padlock with you.
- For part-time students only: All books required for your studies will be sent to you by post. It is therefore important to update any changes of address in good time via the TH Wildau online portal.

The library looks forward to your visit

- (Sopening hours during lecture and exam periods: Monday to Friday 9:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.
- Opening hours during lecture-free periods: Monday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Tuesday 9:00 a.m. to 6:00p.m.

Students at TH Wildau can apply for 24/7 access to the university library. This allows you to access the library outside of regular opening hours using your university ID card.





STUDY ONLINE

A complete online degree programme is not currently offered - many courses take place in person. However, there are various digital teaching formats available. To ensure that you are well prepared, you will find all the important information at a glance here.

Technical requirements

- Laptop with 2.2 GHz processor, at least 4 GB RAM (recommended: 8 GB)
- Stable internet connection (e.g. for video streaming)
- Quiet, well-equipped workplace at home

Online lectures

Many courses use tools such as BigBlueButton or Cisco Webex. Please note the following:

- Test your technology and software in advance
- Log in with your first and last name, activate your camera at the beginning
- Use a headset and mute your microphone
- Use the chat function for questions and discussion
- Ask teachers for recordings if necessary

Effective online collaboration

Study groups promote motivation and learning success. Tips for organisation:

- Group size: 2–5 people is ideal
- Define goals and roles (e.g. moderator) at an early stage
- Regular meetings & clear distribution of tasks
- Define weekly goals and review progress

- Moodle for course organisation & communication instructions at en.th-wildau.de/e-learning
- Nextcloud for shared documents & group work
- Messenger groups (please note data protection regulations!)

Examination dates/examination periods

You will be **automatically registered** for the examinations when you re-register. The lecturers will announce the examination modalities within the first weeks of the course. The examination modalities are specified in the examination schedule. The binding announcement of examination dates is made via the TH Wildau online portal (thonline. th-wildau.de). In addition, the dates are published in the timetable and examination schedule (en.th-wildau.de/study/class-and-examination-schedule).

For more detailed information on the types of examinations, the respective examination schedules and the legal basis, please refer to the valid framework regulations and the study and examination regulations applicable to you (th-wildau.de/amtliche-mitteilungen).

Withdrawal from examinations

If you are unable to take an exam or resit, you can **deregister yourself** on the TH Online portal. The respective deregistration deadlines may vary depending on the type of exam (FMP, KMP or SMP) and are regulated in the TH Wildau framework regulations.

Illness

If you are ill on the date of an examination, you can submit a completed "Application for notification of inability to take an examination" including a medical certificate to the dean's office of the department within three working days. The examination board will decide whether you will be allowed to take the examination.

For semester-long examinations (SMP), submit your completed notification of inability to take the examination directly to your lecturer. The lecturer will decide to what extent compensation can be granted. Details are regulated by the framework regulations of the TH Wildau.

Examination

Examination requirements may be fulfilled orally, in writing through written examinations and other written assignments, as project work, as laboratory experiments, or through other controlled work that can be assessed using the same criteria. The regulations can be found in the general regulations in conjunction with the respective study and examination regulations.

Examination results

Examination results are announced individually on the TH Wildau online portal (thonline.th-wildau.de).

Examination review

Students generally have the right to review their exams within four weeks of the publication of the exam results. Please contact your lecturer for more information.

Proof of academic achievement

You can access your exam results (grade transcript) at any time on the TH Wildau online portal (thonline.th-wildau.de) or obtain them for a fee from the Enrolment and Examinations Office.

Recognition of examination achievements

Examination results already obtained at other universities can be recognised for the current semester in which the module to be recognised is taught according to the study plan, up to six weeks after the start of the semester. Applications must be submitted to the relevant examination board of the department.

Certified documents on the individual module contents, grades, certificates and other evidence must be enclosed.



RE-REGISTRATION FOR THE NEXT SEMESTER

Students at TH Wildau must re-register for each semester, in November for the following summer semester (deadline 30 November) and in May for the following winter semester (deadline 31 May). Information about re-registration will be sent to your university email account and published on notice boards and on the website. Re-registration is completed upon timely payment of tuition and fees. Re-registration is only complete once the full semester fee has been received.

After each re-registration, students must update their university ID card (chip card). To do this, use one of the validation stations (Houses 13, 15, 16 or Hall 17). The chip card will be printed at these machines.

SEMESTER

At the Technical University of Applied Sciences in Wildau, the winter semester begins on 1 September and ends on 28 or 29 February of the following year. The summer semester begins on 1 March and ends on 31 August. 

MODERN CAMPUS UNIVERSITY WITH TRADITION

Wildau University of Applied Sciences was founded in 1991, but the site has a much longer tradition of engineering education. In 1898, Germany's third largest locomotive manufacturer, Berliner Maschinenbau AG, formerly L. Schwartzkopff, built a new factory and housing estate for workers on the 600,000 square metre site. In 1949, to meet the growing demand for skilled workers, a technical school for locomotive and wagon construction was founded. In the course of the re-profiling of the site as a heavy engineering centre, this became the Ingenieurschule für Maschinen Wildau (ISW) - the immediate predecessor of today's TH Wildau. The institution quickly gained a good reputation for training mechanical engineers. This was mainly due to its direct links with local engineering companies, its solid and application-oriented knowledge transfer and the modern equipment in its laboratories.

COMMITTEES

Within the framework of academic self-administration, decisions and resolutions concerning the strategy and development of the university, the structure of degree programmes and other matters are made in various committees. The central decision-making body of the university is the Senate, while the most important decision-making bodies of the departments are the departmental councils.

Senate

The Senate is the central decision-making body of the university and acts as a supervisory board. It elects the president of the university, issues the basic regulations and other central statutes, and decides on proposals from the departments for the appointment of professors. The Senate deals with questions of strategy and development at TH Wildau.

The Senate is made up of

- 6 professors
- 2 academic employees
- 2 students and
- 1 other employee

The members of the Senate are elected by the respective group in university-wide elections every two years. However, students are elected annually, similar to the election to the departmental council.

Quality and Accreditation Commission

The Technical University of Applied Sciences Wildau has been system-accredited since 31 March 2015. The subject of the system accreditation is the university's internal quality assurance system. The Quality and Accreditation Commission is an essential part of the internal accreditation system. Within this system, the degree programmes at TH Wildau are accredited every eight years. In addition, as part of the annual quality audit - an inventory of changes within all study programmes, which are reviewed for their relevance to the existing accreditation. Finally, the Quality and Accreditation Commission makes accreditation decisions or recommends measures within the framework of the annual quality audit.

The members of the Quality and Accreditation Commission are appointed by the Senate. The objectives and organisational principles of the Commission are derived from the statutes adopted by the Senate.

- 1 practice representative
- 2 students

STUDENT REPRESENTATION

All students at TH Wildau together form the student body of our university. As a legally recognised sub-organisation, it manages its own affairs.

Tasks of the student representatives:

- Representing the interests of students
- the promotion of political education and the intellectual and artistic interests of its members
- participation in the fulfilment of the tasks of the universities, in particular by issuing statements on university-related or science policy issues
- Supporting the social concerns of its members
- Cultivating supra-regional and inter-regional dialogue national relations of the students
- the promotion of sport as part of the university sports programme

The tasks of the student body at the TH Wildau are carried out by the Student Council (StuRa) and the Student Parliament (StuPa).



StuPa – Student Parliament

The student parliament is the highest decision-making body of the student body. It elects and monitors the StuRa officers, approves the budget and decides on programme guidelines. The StuPa is elected once a year by all students at the university. It is made up of up to 21 student representatives.

FACULTIES

The tasks of the faculties include the organisation of studies, the taking of examinations and the organisation of research. The TH Wildau is divided into two faculties in which the individual degree programmes are located:

- Engineering and Natural Sciences (INW)
- Business, Computing, Law (WIR)

The faculties are self-governing. Decisions on the design of degree programmes, curricula, the employment of lecturers, appointments of new staff, student applications, etc. are made in the committees of a faculty. Students are also represented on these committees.

Faculty Board

The faculty council is the most important decision-making body of a faculty. All decisions regarding the structure of degree programmes, staffing, etc. are made here.

The members of the Faculty Board are:

- 6 professors
- 2 scientific employees
- 1 other employee
- 2 students

The Faculty Board also elects the representatives of these groups to the Examination Board or the appointment committees. The student members of the Faculty Council represent the interests of the students. If you have a concern, it is best to contact the student representative of your faculty.

Examinations Board

The Examination Board decides on student applications in examination matters. The meetings take place at regular intervals.

Study Commission

The study commission of a faculty is responsible for the subject-related and content-related processing of didactic and methodological issues of all degree programmes in the faculty and is constantly responsible for the planning and design of teaching as well as for the further development of module handbooks and curricula. Meetings are usually held once a semester. The Study Commission is a committee that is open to the teaching staff at the faculty without permanent members; as a rule, at least the respective degree programme spokespersons and the Dean are members. Students from different degree programmes may also be represented in the consultations. This gives students the opportunity to participate in the design and further development of the degree programmes and the department.

Degree Programme Directors

A course spokesperson is appointed for each degree programme to coordinate the subject, content and organisation.

He or she is responsible for professional cooperation and coordination of content and has a significant influence on the organisational process of the respective degree programme. You can find your degree programme spokesperson in the section of the respective department.

BAföG Representative

In the INW department, the respective degree programme spokesperson is also the BAföG representative.

In the WIR department, Prof Dr Peter Hantel, Prof Dr Iciar Dominguez Lacasa and Prof Dr Stephan Meyer are BAföG officers.

Internship Representative

The internship coordinator will inform and support you in the preparation and organisation of the practical semester and the selection of an internship company.

Year Mentors

Year mentors are appointed for each degree programme. These mentors accompany and advise the students of a year group during the entire standard period of study. The mentor is your contact person for questions regarding special features of the course of study, e.g. study abroad periods, the choice of specialisations/ elective modules, preparation for practical study periods, final phases and changing degree programmes. You can enquire about your year mentor from your degree programme spokesperson.

Seminar Group Spokesperson or Course Spokesperson

At the start of the programme, each seminar group elects a seminar group spokesperson (also known as a course spokesperson) and a deputy. They represent the seminar groups vis-à-vis the lecturers and the degree programme spokesperson.

The seminar group spokesperson is responsible for forwarding university information to the seminar group. For this purpose, he or she sets up a seminar group distribution list (by e-mail). On the other hand, the seminar group spokesperson takes part in degree programme meetings with other seminar group spokespersons and is involved in the organisation of events for the seminar group.



VINN:LAB -MAKERSPACE AT TH WILDAU

The Venture Innovation Lab (ViNN:Lab for short) at TH Wildau is a makerspace that stands out thanks to its innovative and digital rapid prototyping options, such as 3D printing and laser cutting.



As an open laboratory for everyone and part of the global FabLab network and the association of open workshops, it offers the opportunity to experience and learn various 3D printing processes (FDM and SLA), 3D scanning, laser cutting, CNC milling and the handling of electronic components. Additional equipment such as a digital embroidery machine, a cutting plotter, a vacuum former and an airbrush system complete the range.

The ViNN:Lab has workstations with software for design and construction work (CAD, Illustrator, Photoshop) so that you can design and produce your own prototypes and ideas.

The lab's current workshops (such as basics of 3D printing, construction, textile design, Photoshop, and much more) can be found at vinnlab.de/ events.


As a space for innovation, ViNN:Lab offers support and materials for the application of creative methods for presenting ideas and developing strategy and innovation processes for start-ups, among others.
